

UNIFORM PATCH PLACEMENT

The uniform is an important part of the Scouting program as it has been since scouting was first started. The uniform identifies the boys and adults with Cub Scouts and gives them a sense of belonging to the den, the pack, and the Boy Scouts of America. Scouts should wear their uniforms to all den meetings, pack meetings, and special pack activities.

The uniform for the Tiger Cub, Wolf or Bear Scout is the official blue Cub Scout shirt, neckerchief, and blue web belt with a Cub Scout buckle. The official cap is optional. **Tip:** Purchase a short-sleeved rather than long-sleeved shirt for your Cub Scout. The short-sleeved shirts are less expensive, cooler in active play, and will not be outgrown as fast as long-sleeved. One short-sleeved shirt should last for the 3 years he'll need it.
